
## Sense of Belonging: Photos

## **Removing Barriers:** Tics and Forest School clothing

As the warmer months arrive, it's important to remain thoughtful and safe when spending time outdoors. Tics are small parasites that can latch onto skin, particularly in grassy or wooded areas. To help prevent bites, we encourage children to wear long sleeves and trousers, use insect repellent, and check for tics after outdoor activities. Prompt removal is essential, so if your child does get a tic, please seek appropriate guidance.

Outdoor adventures are at their best when children are safe and comfortable! For Forest School, please ensure



that your child wears long sleeves and trousers to protect against scrapes, insect bites, and sun exposure. On warmer days, opt for loose-fitting clothing to keep them cool while maintaining essential coverage.

## Sense of Belonging: Barn Owls

In Barn Owls, we've been diving into narrative writing inspired by Goodnight Mister Tom. The children have been exploring how to use a range of formality in their writing, crafting dialogue and narration for a variety of characters including a very slangy farmer, an innocent young child, and a highly formal prime minister speaking on the radio. This has given them a great opportunity to experiment with tone, vocabulary, and voice, and they've done a brilliant job capturing the distinct personalities of each character.



In maths, we've been focusing on angles; learning how to draw

them accurately and measure them using a protractor. The children have shown great precision and care in developing these skills. In history, our topic has been Ancient Greece. We've been investigating the differences and similarities between the major city-states, such as Athens and Sparta, and drawing comparisons to aspects of our modern world.

## Sense of Belonging: Magpies

We've had a fantastic week in Magpies Class, full of creativity, curiosity, and hands-on learning! It was so lovely to welcome so many of you into class on Monday to see the children's wonderful artistic creations and to flick through their sketchbooks. In English, we've been diving into the dramatic story of Eyam, the plague village, through role play and writing our own playscript scenes. The children have shown great empathy and imagination in bringing this historical tale to life. In Whole Class Reading, we're enjoying \*The Hacker\* by Malorie Blackman, exploring themes of technology, trust, and teamwork. In spelling, we've been focusing on homophones, words that sound the same but have different meanings and spellings, and practicing using them correctly in context.

In maths, we've been learning all about money, calculating totals, making amounts, and solving real-life problems involving coins and notes. Our new history topic on Ancient Egypt has begun with great excitement as we explore when and where this fascinating civilization began. In science, we've been learning about the



human skeleton and how it protects our vital organs, including a fun experiment using an egg in a jar of water to simulate how our bones protect us.



# Sense of Belonging: Kingfishers

In Kingfishers, the children have been writing powerful and thoughtful stories about the Great Fire of London. Their narratives show a deep understanding of the historical event, with many choosing to build the tension slowly and carefully, capturing the growing danger with patience and sensitivity. The writing has been both imaginative and respectful, and it's been wonderful to see how each child has brought their own voice to this dramatic moment in history.

In maths, we've continued our work on money, developing confidence in calculating totals, giving change, and solving real-life problems. In RE, we've been exploring the big question: Why should we care for others and why does it matter? This has led to some meaningful discussions about empathy, kindness, and the impact our actions can have on those around us.

#### Sense of Belonging: Robins

In Robins, we've been having lots of fun exploring numbers using our brand-new Numberblocks equipment. The children have been breaking down numbers into their smaller parts and then rebuilding them to understand how numbers are related and how they work together to make a whole. This hands-on approach has really helped deepen their number sense and confidence with early maths concepts.



Outdoors, we've been combining physical activity with maths by using beanbags

to practise shot put while also scoring points and adding up our totals. It's been a great way to keep active and sharpen our mental maths skills at the same time. In PE, we've also been getting ready for Sports Day by practising our running, jumping, and throwing skills. The children have shown great enthusiasm and teamwork as they prepare for the big day!




