Have an incredible Dunsford show, have fun and spread the Dunsford positivity and thank you for standing with us. ♥


Stronger Together: Dunsford Show Programme Cover (Guest Author: Julia Matthews)

Removing Barriers: Childcare for under-3s

Starting this September, eligible working families with children under 3 will see their funded childcare increase from 15 to 30 hours per week.

Families can apply for 30 hours of childcare from the term after their child turns 9 months old, continuing until they start school. Under this funding, children can begin attending our nursery from the day they turn two.

This expansion is designed to support your child's early education and help you better balance work and family life. It's the final phase of the childcare expansion, which could save families up to £7,500 per year.

Apply for your childcare code by 31 August to start using the support from September

As the warmer months arrive, it's important to remain thoughtful and safe when spending time outdoors. Tics are small parasites that can latch onto skin, particularly in grassy or wooded areas. To help prevent bites, we encourage children to wear long sleeves and trousers, use insect repellent, and check for tics after outdoor activities. Prompt removal is essential, so if your child does get a tic, please seek appropriate guidance.







Outdoor adventures are at their best when children are safe and comfortable! For Forest School, please ensure that your child wears long sleeves and trousers to protect against scrapes, insect bites, and sun exposure. On warmer days, opt for loose-fitting clothing to keep them cool while maintaining essential coverage.


Sense of Belonging: Barn Owls

After a day packed with excitement, the group settled in for an overnight stay, even if sometimes sleep was in short supply with all the buzz and laughter! Sense of Belonging: Magpies

In English, we've been exploring The Whale by Ethan Murrow. With no words in the book, the children have been using their imaginations to tell the story themselves, developing their narrative skills and descriptive language. In Whole Class Reading, we've been reading and performing poetry, focusing on rhythm, expression, and performance techniques. Our Spelling lessons have centred around words ending in "ally," helping us understand spelling patterns and word formation. In Maths, we've been identifying different types of lines and triangles, as well as naming a variety of 2D and 3D shapes.



In History, we've continued our journey through Ancient Egypt, learning about the fascinating process of mummification and the beliefs surrounding the afterlife. PE has been all about preparing for Sports Day, with lots of practice in different events and building team spirit. In Computing, we've been using Photopea to edit photos, learning how to enhance and manipulate images. Our Art lessons have focused on drawing daffodils, inspired by our school logo. In DT, we've been designing and planning our own healthy snack bars, combining creativity with healthy choices.



Sense of Belonging: Kingfishers

The Kingfishers have had a creative and active week! In Art, they've been exploring printing techniques, experimenting with patterns and textures to create some fantastic pieces. In Reading, they've continued to enjoy poetry, building confidence in performance and expression as they explore rhythm and meaning in different poems. In Maths, the children have been learning to tell the time, focusing on quarter past, half past, and quarter to - developing their understanding of time in a fun and practical way.

With Sports Day just around the corner, the children have also been practising their throwing and jumping skills, showing great determination and team spirit. It's been a brilliant week of learning and fun!

Sense of Belonging: Robins






