
#### **Removing : Head lice**

We'd like to remind all families to regularly check their child's hair for head lice. These tiny insects are common in school-aged children and can spread easily through close contact. While they're not a sign of poor hygiene and don't carry disease, they can be uncomfortable and itchy. Please take a few minutes each week to check your child's hair and treat promptly if needed. Treatments are available from pharmacies, and regular combing with a fine-toothed nit comb can help prevent re-infestation. Thank you for helping us keep our school community healthy and itch-free!

## **Removing Barriers:** Tics and Forest School clothing

As the warmer months arrive, it's important to remain thoughtful and safe when spending time outdoors. Tics are small parasites that can latch onto skin, particularly in grassy or wooded areas. To help prevent bites, we encourage children to wear long sleeves and trousers, use insect repellent, and check for tics after outdoor activities. Prompt removal is essential, so if your child does get a tic, please seek appropriate guidance.

Outdoor adventures are at their best when children are safe and comfortable! For Forest School, please ensure that your child wears long sleeves and trousers to protect against scrapes, insect bites, and sun exposure. On warmer days, opt for loose-fitting clothing to keep them cool while maintaining essential coverage.

#### Sense of Belonging: Barn Owls


In Barn Owls, excitement is building as we prepare for our end-ofyear performance! The classroom is buzzing with energy as children learn their lines, practise movements, and bring the show to life. Our prop department is working at full speed, creating all the backstage magic we need. (Tickets will be available at the end of next week... watch this space!)

Alongside the performance preparations, we've been revisiting line graphs in Maths and diving into Ancient Greek history, exploring the fascinating contrasts between democracy and autocracy. In PE, we're getting ready for Sports Day with lots of running, jumping, and throwing, developing both our skills and our team spirit!



#### Sense of Belonging: Magpies

The children have been busy crafting their own playscripts to retell the classic tale of Little Red Riding Hood, showcasing wonderful creativity through dialogue and stage directions. In Whole Class Reading, we've been exploring poetry, diving into rhythm, rhyme, and meaning. The children have enjoyed discussing their favourite



poems and performing them with great expression. Our spelling sessions have continued to build confidence and accuracy, with a focus on key patterns and rules. In Maths, we've been learning about turns and angles, with children enthusiastically giving each other instructions for quarter, half, and three-quarter turns This was a fun and active way to grasp direction and movement!

In History, our journey through Ancient Egypt has taken us to pyramids, tombs, and fascinating beliefs about the afterlife, sparking curiosity and awe. In Science, we've been investigating the nutritional content of various foods, comparing sugar, carbohydrates, protein, fibre, and salt: encouraging healthy eating awareness. With Sports Day approaching, Magpie Class has been practising hard in PE, showing fantastic teamwork and enthusiasm. In Design and Technology, the children have been tasting ingredients for healthy snacks - a delicious and educational experience! And in Spanish, thanks to Mrs Govier, the children have learned to sing "Happy Birthday" in Spanish, adding a musical twist to their language learning.

Finally, a heartfelt thank you to all the children and parents for secretly planning my special 50th birthday party - it was so wonderful and something I will remember forever. Thank you too for the beautiful flowers, cards, chocolates and bottles!



#### Sense of Belonging: Kingfishers

In Kingfishers, we've been learning to tell the time using "o'clock" and "half past" in Maths. To support this learning, please do point out these times on clocks at home, it really helps reinforce their understanding. In English, we've been exploring a variety of poems, identifying similarities and differences to inspire our own writing. This has set us up beautifully to create poems about Dunsford for our upcoming time capsule project. In Science and Art, we've continued our exploration of plants and fruits, combining creativity and investigation to make discoveries and record our findings in imaginative ways.

In our swimming lessons, we have practiced swimming up and down the pool, ready for the gala!


#### Sense of Belonging: Robins




